Volunteer Retention ideas...

These quick tips from "VolunteerPro" give us something to consider when addressing volunteer retention.

- 1. Participation Efficacy volunteers need to feel effective, rather than underused or unnecessary.
- 2. Group Integration volunteers need to feel that they have positive relationships with both their peers and paid staff
- 3. Organizational Support volunteers need to be able to get help when needed, acknowledgment of work, and feedback on performance
- Perception of Voice volunteers have a much greater chance of burnout when they feel they have no say in circumstances that impact them.

A Christmas Fundraiser
